Purpose of the funds:

To help cities and their communities recover and stabilize from the fiscal impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic.









- Signed by President Biden on March 11
- Funding for Critical Projects
 - \$195 billion for states
 - \$130 billion for local governments
 - \$20 billion for tribal governments
 - \$4.5 billion for territories








American Rescue Plan

- Treasury Rules due by May 10
- Direct Funding for Cities
- Uses:
 - **COVID-19 Response/Mitigation**
 - Revenue loss
 - Infrastructure: water, sewer broadband
 - Premium pay to eligible workers





Entitlement Cities

"Direct Payment of funds from Treasury"

Need **DUNS** number **AND SAM** registration

Begin gathering payment information:

- EIN, name, contact information
- Name and title of an authorized representative of the entity
- Financial institution information
 - (routing/account, financial institution name and contact information)





Non-Entitlement Cities

- All other cities
- Distribution from the State of Iowa
- Need <u>DUNS</u> number

What are DUNS and SAMS #s?





What are DUNS and SAMS #s?

- DUNS: is a unique 9-digit identifier issued and maintained by Duns & Bradstreet (D&B) that verifies the existence of a business entity/organization globally.
- SAMS: All entities—people or organizations wishing to do business with the federal government—must register in SAMS.
 - Businesses and grant or loan
 recipients must have an active SAM
 registration to receive federal funds
 - Registrations must be updated every
 12 months to remain active





DUNS/SAMS:

American Rescue Plan

- Entitlement cities will need both a DUNS and SAMS number.
 - Check to be sure your SAMS
 registration is active (must renew
 annually).
- Non-entitlement cities will need a DUNS number.
 - A SAMS number is not required, but cities may consider registering for one anyway (free) if they plan to apply for federal or certain state grants.





Finding your DUNS number

- Website: https://fedgov.dnb.com/webform/
- Search! Most, if not all, cities have an existing DUNS number.
- If your city does not have a DUNS number, you can register for one.

- You will need your DUNS number first, and:
 - General city information, EIN/TIN, financial/banking institution information, contact information for authorized representatives, CAGE Code (if applicable)
 - Up to 30 days to process (average 7-10)
